- Business Development Board providing updates to businesses on: bdbmc.org/covid-19-biz-hub

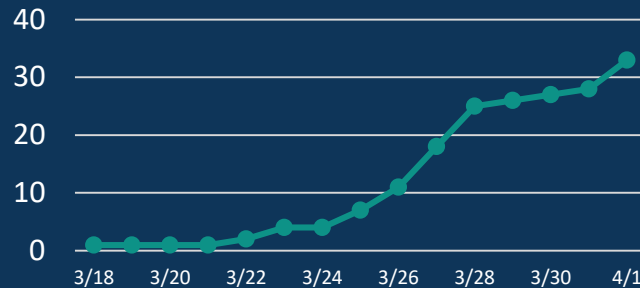

State Actions

- Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order #20-91 which is effective April 3-April 30. This EO outlines that residents are safer at home, and states senior citizens and individuals with underlying medical conditions shall stay at home and take all measures to limit potential exposure.
- All Floridians shall limit their movements and personal interactions outside their home to only those necessary to obtain or provide essential services or conduct essential activities.
- Residents and businesses are encouraged to review the list of essential workers at floridadisaster.org
- Businesses are encouraged to provide delivery, carry-out, or curbside service to the greatest extent possible.

Martin County Cases

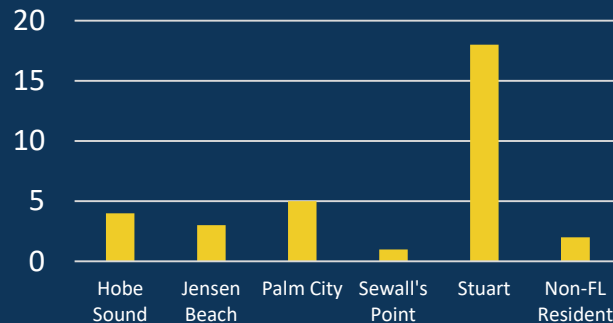


Testing Completed
